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Introduction and General Instructions

In the [A-R Music Anthology](#) Content Guides, you will find curated materials for review of Western (classical) music history, each prepared by a specialist in the area covered. This Guide will aid students and faculty alike to navigate the [Anthology](#)'s coverage of music history's major works, stylistic currents, and artists in the cultural, political, and social contexts of this music from the Middle Ages to the present. The Guides provide entry points into the various textual and score materials of the [A-R Music Anthology](#). It can serve as one organized way of accessing the wide variety and large number of items included in this online resource.

Each of these fourteen Guides provides about a week's worth of content, assuming daily study. Each Guide contains the following sections:

- **Assigned Readings.** The main readings for each workbook come from the [A-R Music Anthology](#). Occasionally, workbooks may also reproduce supplementary readings from

other sources; publication details will always be provided for these sources so that students may explore further.

- **Summary lists.** These lists provide important names, places, compositions, and concepts that users should understand by the time they move on to the next unit. They are subdivided into the following categories:
 - *Genres to Understand*
 - *Musical Terms to Understand*
 - *Contextual Terms, Figures, and Events*
 - *Main Concepts*
- **Scores and Recordings.** The workbooks point users to scores from the [Anthology](#), as well as to freely available scores and recordings from other internet sources.
- **Exercises.** Each unit allows users to test their understanding of the items found in the summary lists. These exercises vary from unit-to-unit, as each era requires different amounts of terminology and skills to understand its repertoires. Keys follow the exercises to provide users with ways of self-checking their understanding.
